They were evaluated objectively. From this period, new themes, first of all, events related to national history attracted many

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artists. Portraits and compositions related to national history appeared in art..." (p. 2.205).

A large number of exhibitions held in 1991-2000 confirm that easel painting of this period is distinguished by the variety of styles compositional solutions. This, in turn, developed in all respects to the new era, which gave artists the opportunity to independently choose the form and means of expression in the artistic image.
